Points to Ponder

The Bible is full of references to the morning, using this tangible, everyday occurrence to illustrate the refreshment and renewal that Christians believe is on offer through the presence of God. The book of Lamentations reminds readers that, 'The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning'. Psalm 30 gives the encouragement that 'Weeping may last for the night, but joy comes with the morning'. I love mornings. I will happily wake up with my alarm and bounce straight out of bed, picking up unfinished conversations with my husband from the night before and thinking through the day ahead. Mistakes have not yet been made, ideas have yet to be tested, and nobody quite knows exactly how the day will pan out. It's exciting, if we allow it to be. Mornings, especially early ones, buzz with potential. Perhaps this is why Jesus embraced them, too. Luke's gospel tells us that Jesus would preach in the temple 'early in the morning'. Mark's gospel similarly reports that Jesus would get up 'very early in the morning, while it was still dark', in order to pray. And, perhaps most significant of all, the resurrection of Jesus was discovered 'at dawn on the first day of the week' (Matthew 28:1). Easter Sunday is a time when Christians remember that the extraordinary, history—shaping resurrection of Jesus means a fresh start. A new day, filled with space for forgiveness, celebration and hope. The resurrection is the sign to all who wish to see it that death—in all its thievery and pain—is not the end, and that another reality is possible.
